# **Captain's Report**

The 2022 golf year was certainly an improvement on the previous couple of years where 12 games were interrupted by covid lockdowns and wet weather.

It was again an honour to serve as Captain of the Hume Veterans Golf Club and participate in the administration and success of the group.

The smooth and efficient running of our Competitions through the year can only happen with the assistance of dedicated committee members. They all share in the tasks of coordinating field entry and payments, card preparation and correlation and prize presentations. I thank you all for your sustained efforts and the members for their cooperation on match days. Thank you to Vice Captain Bill Mandouit for his assistance and officiating in my absence.

Thanks also to President Alan Kinnaird for his leadership of the club and to Kerry Bayly our Webmaster for his continued input in maintaining the website and streamlining our golfing experience using the MiScore system. A special mention also, to Arnold Messias for his behind-the-scenes efforts in compiling our informative and entertaining monthly news letter.

The annual grudge match held in Jan between Melbourne and Hume Veterans, saw the shield go to Melbourne Vets with a narrow margin of 10 games to 9.

The competitions for the year started on a sour note at Werribee Park GC with thunderstorms and rain causing abandonment of the game after 13 holes of play. We had good starts with weather and courses, with a very frosty start to the Kooringal game. Wet weather set in from Aug rendering many courses around Melbourne unplayable and resulted in postponement and then cancellation of the Nov Craigieburn game.

We were fortunate to be able to play in Aug and move the 2 Championship rounds in Sep and Oct to the Bacchus Marsh Golf Club, which was one of the few courses playable. The year ended with a 4BBB competition at Melbourne Airport.

On average 14% of players score equal to, or better than their handicap in our competitions and the ratio is generally spread evenly over the grades. A score down to around 30 points is usually enough to win a golf ball. Field numbers have ranged from 54 to 83 players over the year with an average around 67.

<u>The Order of Merit competition</u> was decided over 7 games through the year, with the winner Bernie Handke scoring 558 pts, also winning his age group.

31st January 2023. Membership status report for 2022

As at the 31<sup>st</sup> December 22 HVGC had a total of 119 active members, the club had been notified of 8 members that would not be recommitting for 2023.

The club has 3 Life Members that are active. And 4 that are no longer able to attend any club functions.

As at 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2023, HVGC has 119 members of which 12 have not notified the club of their intentions and have not as yet paid membership for 2022. 8 are new members that have joined either in late 2022 or this year. We have 114 male and 5 female members.

We have 8 over 80's that are still active and participate regularly.

I again reiterate that the club must vigorously recruit new members to replace the natural attrition of membership due to age, illness or pursuing other interests. The incentive program of rewarding members by introducing two new members appears to be helping to steady the decline in membership and I would like to strongly recommend that this incentive program continue and maybe be enhanced to encourage more members to participate.

All members that have not renewed their membership by the end of February 6<sup>th</sup> 2023 will be removed from the database and have booking privileges revoked.
