Mt Derrimut Golf & Community club originated in 1923 on a course called "The Rock and Thistle", located between Glengala Road and the Kororoit Creek Road in Sunshine.

The club began on 9th July, 1923 at the State Bank of Sunshine with a meeting of local business people interested in forming a golf club. Mr H.V. McKay, of Sunshine Harvester fame, was appointed the Club's Patron, with the first elected president Mr Thacker.

The original course was a 9 hole Par 66, with sandscrape greens. The land was heavily encrusted with lava rock outcrops and thick with scotch thistles. The first clubhouse was built in 1927-28 at a cost of 150 pounds (\$300).

In 1963, the Club voted to relocate to the Fitzgerald Road site and moved in 1964 to play on the 18 hole, par 70 course with grass greens. The land cost 70,000 pounds (\$140,000), course construction 30,000 pounds (\$60,000), and clubhouse 25,000 pounds (\$50,000).

In 2002, the Club again voted to relocate to the Mt Derrimut site. The move took place in November 2007 and is an 18 hole, par 72

championship course with fully irrigated greens and fairways using recycled water.

The golf course at Mt Derrimut is designed by Craig Parry and Pacific Coast Design to complement the historic significance of the site. The clubhouse incorporates the farm homestead built in 1883 with many of the original buildings of the past being retained and used by the Club. The historic dry stone walls are an integral feature on the course.

Mt Derrimut local rules

See Notice Board at the course

To be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf as published by the R&A Rules Limited and any temporary local rules...>

1. Out of Bounds (Rule 27)

Beyond any fence or white stakes with black tops bounding the course;
Clubhouse area, driveway and car park as defined by white stakes with black tops.

2. Trees/Shrubs (Including guard/stake)

If a tree or shrub (under 2 club-lengths in height) interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player MUST take relief as provided in Rule 24-2b (i). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

3. Immovable Obstructions (Rule 24)

All artificially surfaced roads and paths (including gravel), course signage, buildings, sprinkler heads, ropes, hoses and drainage grates are immovable obstructions. Rule 24-2 applies;
Sprinkler Heads and Tap Covers: Specimen Local Rule under "5. Immovable Obstructions close to Putting Green" in Appendix I of the Rules of Golf applies.

4. Heritage Wall (2nd, 3rd, 4th, 6th, 9th, 11th and 18th holes)

The Heritage Wall is defined as an immovable obstruction (unless it acts as a course boundary fence). Rule 24-2 applies.

5. Ground Under Repair (Rule 25)

The following areas are defined as ground under repair. Relief is compulsory. Rule 25-1 applies.

Those areas defined by white stakes, white lines or GUR signage;
Garden Beds with mulch coverings;
Embedded stones through the green.

6. Lateral Water Hazards (Rule 26)

Lateral Water Hazards are identified by red lines and/or stakes. Where a line exists, the line defines the margin of the Lateral Water Hazard.

7. Moveable Obstructions (Rule 24)

Stones in bunkers and course hoops are moveable obstructions

stroke play – two strokes
match play – loss of hole

DAY VOWS TO CHANGE PRESIDENTS CUP ATTITUDE

Jason Day candidly admits his attitude has been lacking in the Presidents Cup previously and he wants to make amends at Royal Melbourne in December – hopefully in a glamour pairing with Adam Scott.

Former World No.1 Day's record for the International team in the biennial clashes with the powerhouse United States team is poor – earning just seven points from 20 matches across four Presidents Cup contests.

In the foursomes format, he has no wins from eight outings.

Day admitted on Tuesday that the timing of the Cup contests late in the year had found him wanting.

"I'm the first one to put my hand up ... Because, unfortunately, it has to start at

the top, and I've made mistakes with regards to not mentally being there," said Day of his 2017 Cup performance in South Korea where he went 1-3-1.

"I need to understand we've got 11 other guys on the team that are trying just as hard or trying even harder than myself, so I've got to pick the slack up too."

Internationals captain Ernie Els is trying to reverse the team's long losing streak by


building culture and combinations for the future.
