4. Burnt ash piles
5. Old pine plantations marked with white stakes

PRESIDENT'S PROFILE

Alan Kinnaird is 72 in February and was born in Portland, Victoria, second eldest of 5 siblings. He attended Portland High School and achieved his HSC (year 12).

He moved to Melbourne at 18 years of age and started his career as a junior shipping clerk with Wilhelmsen Agency at 51 William Street. At the same time he was invited to play with South Melbourne under 19's and in 1966 and was selected to play against St Kilda in a Semi-Final at the MCG (when the under 19s and reserves played prior to the VFL Grand final), but it was an inglorious performance and was substituted off after running into an open goal and kicking it out of bounds.

During his 22 years with Wilhelmsen Agency where he progressed to the position of Assistant Manager, he was given the opportunity to visit sister ports in Asia and Europe, and in 1986 led a trade delegation to the Middle East by virtue of him being State President of the Australia and Arab Chamber of Commerce (Victorian Chapter). Alan then worked for several other Shipping Companies for the next 14 years from 1990 including McArthur Shipping, Seaport Shipping, OOCL and China Shipping. In 2005 he was retrenched and after a short retirement (conflict at home plus boredom) returned to part time work as a School Bus Driver, Security Officer with Melbourne Olympic Park, and a field officer conducting interviews for the Australian Bureau of Statistics, which well and truly filled out the week. In 2008 joined G4S as a Prisoner Transport Officer where he still works casually for a few hours a week.

Alan took up golf at 14 years of age in Portland and joined Sunshine GC when he arrived in Melbourne and then moved to Koorringal, where he has been a member for over 45 years. He served on the committee for several years in the early 90's and has witnessed vast changes to the layout, mostly positive.



Alan has been married to Norma for nearly 48 years and has a daughter, Denise (Gisborne members would know her as "Dee" where she worked at the club in the administrative office for several years), and a son, David who lives Gladstone Park. Alan and Norma lived in Williamstown from 1972 until December 2001 when they moved to Seabrook where they still reside. Other than golf he enjoys swimming (at Laverton Pool) and cruising to as many parts of the globe as possible (10th cruise coming up).

He joined the Hume Vets 5 years ago and has served on the Committee for the past three years.

Alan is honoured to be elected as President and is mindful of the progress and strong leadership from previous Committee and Executives of the Hume Veterans.

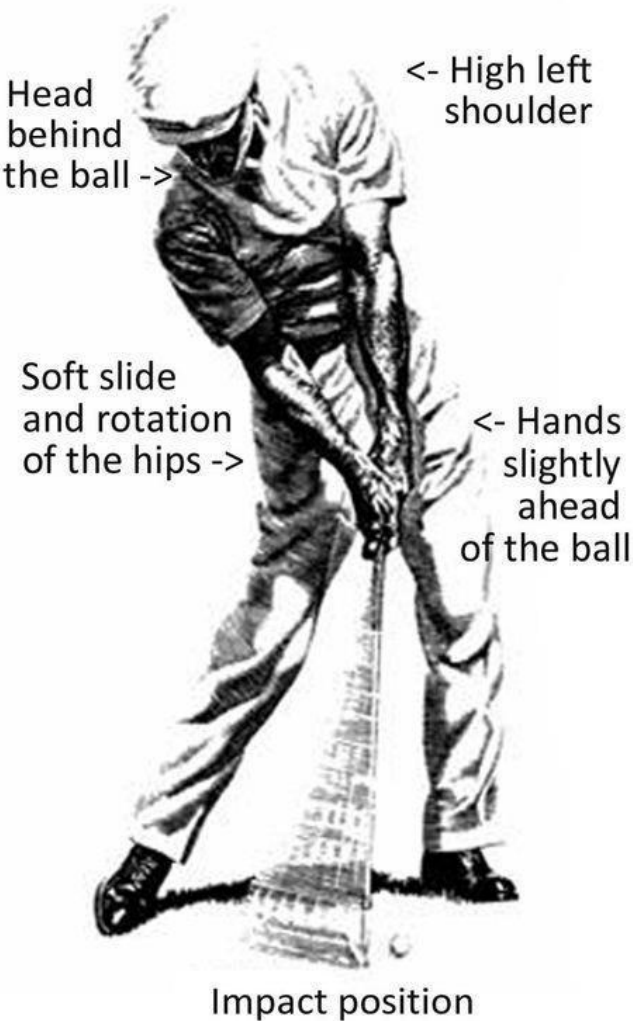

New World Handicap System

Golfers around the world will soon play under a standardized handicapping system, but what does it mean for Australian golfers?

A new World Handicap System has taken effect in Australia from January 30, 2020 meaning that you can take your handicap to any golf destination in the world.

But Australia had only recently overhauled its handicapping system, so you may be wondering if this will change have much impact on Australian golfers?

Luckily for us, it won't have much impact as almost all the new World Handicap System regulations are already in place in Australian golf.

Australia's move to the current system over the past few years has been closely monitored by the world golf governing bodies who were always looking to implement a standard international handicapping system.

So what changes have there been to the Australian handicapping system?

Golf Australia has been working hard to inform all Australian golf clubs on the changes of the switch over in January 2020 and they've summarized the four changes here:

- **Bonus Reduction for Exceptional Net Score**

GOLF Link will apply an automated extra reduction to a player's GA Handicap for any net score that is at least 7 strokes better than it.

- **Soft Cap**

In addition to the existing Hard Cap of 5 strokes, a Soft Cap is being introduced. The Soft Cap will take effect once a player's GA Handicap increases to 3 strokes above its best point for the previous 12 months. Once in the Soft Cap zone, a player's

GA Handicap will only be allowed to increase by 50% of the calculated amount.

- **Adjustment made to Daily Handicap if Scratch Rating is different to Par**

This will make 36 Stableford points (or net par) the universal measure of a golfer playing to their handicap. As a result, it will become simple to conduct mixed-gender or multi-tee competitions. Examples of the adjustment: If Scratch Rating 73 & Par 70; 3 is added to the Daily Handicap calculation (i.e. $73 - 70 = +3$). If Scratch Rating 68 & Par 70; 2 is subtracted from the Daily Handicap calculation (i.e. $68 - 70 = -2$).

- **Transfer of 0.93 Multiplier**

The 0.93 Multiplier will be transferred out of the GA Handicap calculation and into the Daily Handicap calculation. Note: Our statisticians confirm this change will have no overall impact on the handicaps players play off (i.e. Daily Handicaps). This is because the slight increase it will cause to GA Handicaps (by being removed from the GA Handicap formula), will be the same as the decrease it will cause to Daily Handicaps (by being transferred into the Daily Handicap formula). As a result, there will be no overall impact.

Later in the year, all clubs will receive more information including posters from Golf Australia which will help translate the changes to club golfers.

But the takeaway message is this; while there are some minor changes, Australian golfers (unlike other parts of the world) won't notice too much difference to the current handicapping system we already have in place.

CHAMPIONSHIP CONDITIONS

- 1 All entrants must be a financial member of the "Victorian Vetteran Golfers Association" (VVGA) and an (V.G.A.) affiliated "Home Golf Club".
- 2 **ALL entrants must have played in at lease two (2) District Events in the past 12 months.**
- 3 All entry fees must be paid at time of entry.
- 4 The council of the V.V.G.A. shall have entire management of the tournament including handicapping, the power to alter a handicap at any time during the course of the tournament.
- 5 **Handicap limit of 36 applies to all championship events (does not include social and/or ladies golf).**
- 6 All competitions shall be played in accordance with the rules of golf as adopted by the Royal and Ancient golf of St Andrews.
- 7 The Match committee of the V.V.G.A. shall have the power to deal with and determine any dispute or protest which must be lodged with the V.V.G.A. Secretary within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the days play. The match Committee's decision is final.
- 8 The council of the V.V.G.A. may in the event of adverse weather or any other reason, either shorten the event or fix for another day.
- 9 In the case of ties, V.V.G.A. council shall determine the manner in which the winner shall be decided.
- 10 Entry fees **WILL NOT** be refunded if notice of scratching is notified to **John Moulton** by later than 2 weeks prior to the event.
- 11 Competitors may only win one (1) major trophy for the day.

To promote fellowship amongst representatives or each district, the draw will be arranged so that entrants will play with competitors from other districts.
