From the President – Alan Kinnaird



Greetings members,

I trust that you and your family have stayed safe during the lockdown and at last it appears that we are finally in a position to see our way out of the strict level 4 restrictions after the Premier's press conference on 18th October.

Members living in the Metropolitan area can finally return to golf and all of us have more freedom to move around as further restrictions are lifted.

Regrettably, we have yet again had to cancel our November fixture at Yarrambat due to the 25-kilometre travel restriction that is in place, which will more than likely stay for several weeks to come. Let's hope by Christmas we will be free to enjoy being with our family and friends. Fingers crossed.

All going well we plan to hold our next calendar event at Melbourne Airport on 7th December but it will more than likely be just golf with no lunch or presentation, due to continued indoor restrictions but we will be in a position to clarify this closer to the date. If this is the case, as stated in my last report we will conduct our annual (xmas) free day with raffle as soon as

soon as practicable next year.

The Committee discussed the matter of a fee adjustment in light of the limited golfing calendar but after reviewing our financial status have decided not to make any changes but will hold the annual membership fee at \$60 for next year.

Also with regard to the monthly competition fee for 2021, after obtaining costs from the Club venue's and preparing an income and expenditure forecast, we must advise members that the fee will increase to \$45 for all games except the Championship's in September and October which will be \$50 each month. Also, you will be now required to pay \$20 for the end of year Xmas event commencing December 2021.

Some members may consider this to be excessive, so let me explain how these increases have come about.

Firstly in relation to the competition fee increase, our philosophy is to operate this on a "cost-neutral basis" and when we calculated all the forecast competition costs ie venue costs increases plus costs for the 4 grades and runner up vouchers plus golf ball prizes for closest to the pins, and ball run down along with the monthly birthday prize and bottle scotch raffle, we had no alternative than to make this adjustment otherwise it would result in a loss result. The additional \$5 for the championships is to cover the cost of trophies.

Our decision to impose a charge of \$20 against the end of year event is again based on cost versus income and it was evident that this was a cost that required reviewing.

The \$60 annual membership fee includes a \$25 component that covers each member's ticket allocation for the "Parmaker" raffle but the cost for golf and lunch were mainly covered by fee and

raffle income, thus the decision to recover part of the cost for the day.

Whilst our bank balance is healthy, we will in fact encounter more expenditure this year as a result of the following costs:-

1/Purchase of a Laptop Computer to assist with administrative and competition requirements.

2/ Purchase of an EFTPOS card machine to facilitate cashless payments.

3/ Implementation of "OneGolf" system that Kerry Bayly and his team are currently working on to have ready for our first competition in 2021. This will cost approx. \$3000 and essentially it will provide members with an improved and streamlined online booking system along with other related golf score administrative tasks. Full details will be forthcoming shortly.

Centre unites golf's peak bodies

Australian golf will find a new home in the heart of Melbourne's Sandbelt with a new state-of-the-art facility to be built. The Australian Golf Centre will be the new headquarters for Golf Australia, PGA of Australia, Golf Victoria and Sandringham Golf Links Management.

The \$18.8 million project, majority funded by the Victorian Government's \$15.3 million investment, will create one of the country's premier golf facilities on the site of Sandringham Golf Links, opposite the world-renowned Royal Melbourne Golf Club.

The facility will feature a new public 30-bay driving range with target greens, the redevelopment of the existing 18-hole golf course, a public café and the National High-Performance Centre, which will help shape the next generation of golf heroes. The industry-leading centre will also feature:

- Short game practice area including a large chipping area for the high-performance program
- Coaching facilities to showcase golf's innovative and inclusive programs, including becoming the home of the industry's accreditation program for training PGA professionals to coach people with a disability

- Indoor high-performance training facilities
- A new two-storey building that incorporates office administration space for Golf Australia, PGA of Australia and Sandringham Golf Links staff, in addition to meeting rooms, education spaces and new public amenities and changerooms
- Additional water storage capacity for course irrigation that will reduce the course's reliance on potable water; and
- An extensive revegetation program to increase the number of indigenous trees, vegetation and overall biodiversity value of the site.

The contract for the building construction work, is to be undertaken by local firm 2Construct and expected to generate 24 jobs. The projected completion date for these works is April 2021.

Redevelopment of nine holes has been completed, with the remaining nine holes to be finished by December 2020. The course redesign and construction is being undertaken by Australian golf architects Ogilvy Cocking and Mead, with help from the Royal Melbourne Golf Club.

PGA of Australia chairman Rodger Davis said the project was another sign of the increasing unity in Australian golf. "The Australian Golf Centre will help unify golf's peak bodies and create efficiencies that will introduce more participants to our great game," Davis said.

Golf Australia chairman Andrew Newbold said the centre would generate many benefits.

"Not only for our emerging talent but for Australian professionals as well, which gives the entire industry a base and a place to inspire the next generation into the sport," Newbold said.



Stephen Spargo, president of Golf Victoria, which is the project principal, was excited about the centre’s potential to be a nationally unifying force for the golf community.

“It’s fantastic to see those in the sport rally behind such a great project and we’re delighted that it can take place in the heartland of Melbourne golf,” Spargo said. Victorian Minister for Tourism, Sport and Major Events Martin Pakula said the new centre would enhance the state’s reputation as “the home of golf in Australia” and continue to help the community’s re-emergence from the impacts of Covid-19.

“Golf is a great employer at the local and elite levels and investments like this are important in setting up the industry to thrive on the other side of the pandemic,” Pakula said.

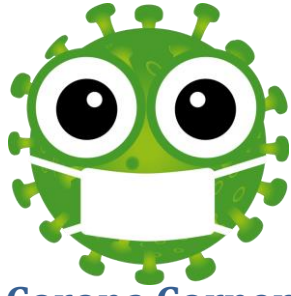

Corona Corner



Dustin Johnson has become the most prominent player to test positive for the coronavirus since the PGA Tour resumed in June, forcing him to withdraw from the CJ Cup at Shadow Creek.

The Tour said in a statement that Johnson notified officials he was experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and was given another test that came back positive.

Johnson is the No.1 player in the world and the reigning PGA Tour player of the year after winning the FedExCup for the first time.

He has not played since he tied for sixth at the US Open last month.

"Obviously, I am very disappointed," Johnson said in a statement.

"I was really looking forward to competing this week but will do everything I can to return as quickly as possible."

"I have already had a few calls with the Tour's medical team and appreciation all

the support and guidance they have given me."

Johnson is the 11th player to test positive since the Tour resumed its schedule on the 8th. June.

Under the protocols on the PGA Tour, which are based on guidance from the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, Johnson is to self-isolate for 10 days dating to when he first experienced symptoms and can return if there are no other symptoms.

That would leave open the possibility of Johnson playing next week at Sherwood, provided he would want to play having gone 10 days without being able to prepare.

Most of the world's best players are in Las Vegas and California for two weeks as part of their preparations for the Masters.

Day begins heavy preparation for Masters

Australian former World No.1 Jason Day will begin the heaviest Masters preparation of his career when he tees off at this week's PGA Tour event in Las Vegas. One month out from the Augusta National major, Day plans on playing three of the four PGA Tour events before the rescheduled Masters begins on November 12.

The Masters is usually held in April but was postponed due to COVID-19.

Queenslander Day will contest the CJ Cup starting on Friday AEDT, an event usually held in Korea, but which was moved to Shadow Creek GC in Nevada.

Day is then slated to play next week's Zozo Championship – relocated from Tokyo, Japan to Los Angeles – and the Houston Open the week before the Masters.

A 12-time PGA Tour winner, Day has never played that many tournaments in the month leading up to Augusta but insists it is needed this year.

"I need to play a lot going into Augusta, because I need to get reps in and find some confidence in the game," Day told AAP from Las Vegas.

Day last year held a share of the 36-hole lead at the Masters and eventually tied fifth, two shots behind winner Tiger Woods.

Day tied for second on his Masters debut (2011) while he finished third behind fellow Australian winner Adam Scott at Augusta in 2013.

Day's search for confidence comes after a missed cut at last week's Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, also in Las Vegas, capped a poor trio of results.

He missed the cut at the PGA Tour play-offs opener, the Northern Trust, then finished near last place at the BMW Championship.

Day hopes that by playing three of four tournaments before the Masters he can rediscover the form he enjoyed as recently as July and August.

The 32-year-old posted four consecutive top-seven results on the PGA Tour, including the US PGA Championship, where he had a final-round chance to win a second major to go with his 2015 win at that event.

"Overall, the foundation is there I just have to keep pushing for more if I want to be a contender at the Masters next month" Day said.

"I have played some really good golf since the PGA Tour resumed (in June from a 90-day suspension) and I know there is great golf in me."

Joining Day in the field this week are fellow Australians Cameron Smith and Marc Leishman.

The CJ Cup is a US\$9.75 million (AU\$13.6m) event with only 78 players and no 36-hole cut and the winner receives US\$1.75m (AU\$2.5m).

Big names at the CJ Cup include two-time winner Justin Thomas, four-time major winner Rory McIlroy and young gun Matthew Wolff.

A golfer, now into his golden years, had a lifelong ambition to play the 17th hole at TPC Sawgrass exactly the way the pros do it.

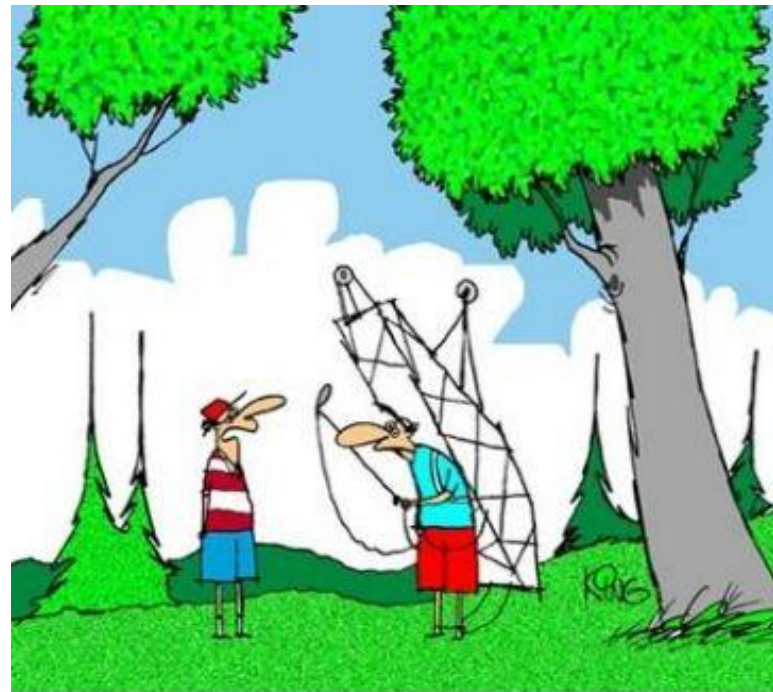
